- Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA.
- Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- Students in the College of Arts and Sciences are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- The [Carolina Core](#) provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- The College of Arts and Sciences requires one U.S. History and one non-U.S. History course, both of which must be chosen from the approved Carolina Core GHS courses. Whichever is not fulfilled through the Carolina Core GHS requirement must be fulfilled through this college requirement.
- The cognate is intended to support the course work in the major. The cognate must consist of twelve hours of courses at the advanced level, outside of, but related to the major. In place of the cognate, a student may choose a minor consisting of at least 18 credit hours of courses concentrated in one area that follow a structured sequence. Students completing the Secondary Education English concentration must also complete an Education coursework component that may fulfill the cognate requirement.
- English Major courses, equaling 30-33 hours, must be comprised of the following: 1) Two courses (6 hours) in pre-1800 Literature; 2) Three courses (9 hours) in post-1800 Literature; and 3) Five ENGL electives (15 hours) above the 300 level, of which at least one elective must satisfy the Linguistics overlay requirement, unless a Linguistics course is applied elsewhere in the student's curriculum. The major in English requires a diversity course, which may also serve as a pre- or post-1800 literature course or an elective. Students who do not meet this Diversity Requirement through another major requirement must take a course in addition to the major requirements. - No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences. The College of Arts and Sciences allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the College of Arts and Sciences.

### Program Notes:

- Courses identified as “critical” must be completed in the student's first 60 semester hours of work in order for these courses to be credited toward graduation.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic bulletin.
- Students may pursue an optional intensive English major, which requires: 1) Three courses (9 hours) in pre-1800 literature; 2) Four courses (12 hours) in post-1800 literature; 3) one course from ENGL 388 or ENGL 440; 4) one course from ENGL 490 or a Senior Thesis; and 5) Four additional courses (12 hours) from ENGL 300 or above, of which one must be selected from ENGL 370, ENGL 389, or ENGL 450-456, unless a Linguistics course is applied elsewhere in the student's curriculum.
- The Departmental Undergraduate Research Track (B.A. with Distinction) is available to students majoring in English who wish to participate in a substantial research or creative project in collaboration with, or under the supervision of, a faculty mentor. Ideally, students who pursue this option would complete their theses by December of their final year of coursework. In addition to the English major requirements, a student must complete the following: 1) ENGL 499 or by taking ENGL 490, provided that the latter course includes a thesis requirement; 2) a minimum GPA of 3.50 in the major; 3) a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.30; 4) Submission of the distinction intent form (available in the undergraduate English office) to the undergraduate English office at the beginning of the semester in which you write your thesis; 5) a public presentation of the Senior Thesis (at an English Department Colloquium Series, USC Discovery Day, or professional conference or journal publication). Students who successfully complete these requirements will be awarded their degree with “Distinction in English” upon graduation.
- This concentration is a step to the fifth-year Master of Teaching (M.T.) program, which is recommended for teacher certification. This concentration will not provide students with teacher certification upon completion.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
